

Adam Hodge

Goalkeeper for Alloa Ath.

Adam joined "The Wasps" on 1st July, 1961 from Blairhall Colliery, signed at that time by manager Archie "Curly" McPherson. Adam was to go on and make 266 first team appearances for the club between 1961 - 1969, before being released on 30th April, 1969. He is the 13th longest serving player to have played for the club since 1945/46 after the Second World War, and only 1 of 20 players who have made over 200 appearances for the club during this period. Only Ronnie Lowrie with 269 appearances has made more first team appearances as a goalkeeper for the club.

Indeed Adam was part of a historic Alloa Athletic side who won the Stirlingshire Cup in Season 1965/66 without scoring a goal - In the 1st Round the club was given a bye, in the semi-final they drew 0-0 with Dumbarton and progressed to the final by virtue of winning a Toss of a coin, then in the final, Stirling Albion pulled out & the trophy was awarded to Alloa Athletic. Adam was more or less ever present in the Alloa Athletic team between 1961 - 1969, apart from Season 1962/63 when he suffered a broken leg in a League Cup tie against Greenock Morton when Bill Beaton took over between the posts.
