People from various parts of Scotland where the mines were closing as the coal was worked to what was supposed to be an area with a hundred years of mining in the Fife coal fields that had a hundred years of coal, sad to say that the dream only lasted twenty years and in the late 1970s the unemployment in the Ballingry area was 27%


